The Trades Widows' Fund Charity Trustees wish to invite grant applications from Charities, local community groups, organisations offering support to individuals, communities and children experiencing hardship arising from food poverty, illness, need for clothing, and the need for general daily support. The Trustees will prioritise local community groups and organisations seeking grants of up to £2,500 and if successful the Fund's preference would be to provide grants via the direct purchase of goods, services, or materials. Charity grants will be limited to a application maximum of £5,000 per unless exceptional circumstances are demonstrated.

<u>Just Transition Communities Project (JTCP)</u>

Through a series of community assemblies, participatory activities and sessions across Aberdeenshire, Aberdeen City and Moray - the project enables communities to explore what a Just Transition in the region means for them. It delves into how communities can take part in driving the process of designing, creating and delivering a "Just Transition".

A just transition seeks to ensure that the substantial benefits of a green economy transition are shared widely and are fair and in support of social justice and climate justice. With a large focus on business, technological and economic solutions, there is a significant gap when it comes to including the voices and solutions of people, places and communities.

MEMBERS' MEETING & AGM ONLINE, 28TH FEBRUARY 2024

Thank you to all who attended the Members' Meeting and AGM on 28th February 2024. It was great to hear updates on all the fantastic work our members are doing and be able to update you all on what we have achieved this financial year and aim to do next year.

The exciting news to come out of our AGM is that we are becoming a charitable company limited by guarantee. A resolution was passed by the Board and CIC members present which adopted new charitable articles of association for NESCAN Hub and authorised a name change from NESCAN Hub CIC to NESCAN Hub Limited. The documentation has all been filed at Companies House so watch this space for an announcement of our charitable status very soon.

The NESCAN Board has also been increased. Alison is stepping down as a director and Jorg, Bruce, Ainhoa, Daria and Kirsten were all confirmed as new directors at the AGM. You'll learn more about our Board members in our next newsletters as we shine the spotlight on them.



UPDATES FROM THE HUB

PEOPLE'S PANEL - 2ND MARCH 2024 SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT, EDINBURGH



Alison and Nicola from **NESCAN** Hub participated in the People's Panel as witnesses on Saturday, 2nd Scottish March at the Parliament. The panel was focused on assessing the approaches to engage and inform citizens in order support to Scotland's climate change objectives.

They were very interested and supportive of the work of the Hub and took on board our concerns about funding and resources for community climate action, among other considerations. They are making recommendations to the Parliamentary Committee for Net Zero, Energy and Transport, which scrutinises the Scottish Governments policies and progress towards Net Zero.
