ENVIRONMENT STANDARDS SCOTLAND -COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMME

Environmental Standards Scotland (ESS) is a relatively new oversight body set up to maintain and enhance Scotland's environmental standards. Being accessible to the public is a priority for ESS, and they have recently launched an engagement programme, reaching out to communities across Scotland to discuss the environmental issues which affect them.

ESS wants communities to understand what their role is and make sure you feel comfortable chatting to them about your environmental concerns, which can include subjects like water pollution, planting trees/infrastructure on peatlands, destruction of wetlands, etc. Things that we know are dear to your hearts. They understand that communities possess valuable local knowledge about their environments and, want to tap into this. Significant change has already been made through ESS' engagement with individuals and communities, the details of which can be found on **their website**.

ESS will join the members meeting on 28th August to discuss their work, what concerns they can address, and how you can contact them. LEAF - LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION FUND

North East Scotland Climate Action Network (NESCAN) Hub on behalf of <u>Aberdeen City Council</u>, launched LEAF—a new environmental fund for projects located in Aberdeen City. LEAF is open to local, not-for-profit, community-led organisations with an annual income under £100,000 based in Aberdeen City. Individual grants can be awarded up to £3,000.

LEAF is currently OPEN until Monday, 5th August 2024.

The purpose of this fund is to support communities to take forward projects that will improve their place, including greenspaces, buildings, and amenities. We aim to empower communities to take action on climate change and biodiversity while improving their neighbourhoods.

FUNDING

The SEED Fund is OPEN



NESCAN Hub has a small pot of funding for community climate action and biodiversity projects within Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire. The Seed Fund is designed for small community projects. Therefore we can only fund organisations with an income of less than £50,000 per annum.

Grants are allocated to eligible projects on a first come first served basis while funds remain. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, grants are a maximum of £500 per organisation to enable us to fund as many organisations and projects as possible.

COMMUNITY CLIMATE COACHES TRAINING

3-4 September 2024 Stirling

Are you involved in community climate initiatives or a climate hub? Are you involved in Transition Towns, XR, or other community-led action? Do you work in local authority or the public sector in a climate or sustainability role?

This free Community Climate Coaches training programme is an exciting opportunity to build your skills, knowledge, and capacity to facilitate and support community-led climate action initiatives. We focus on building personal and community resilience, connecting people to nature and the places where they live, holding space for creative conversations, and increasing understanding and ambition for communities in taking community-based actions to address the climate crisis and build long-term resilience.

This programme is open to anyone with passion and commitment to creating positive change in their community. The CCC training is an Intermediate Level (not a basic introduction to Climate Action).

You will build your capacity to design community engagement processes for climate action initiatives, based on a 6 phase CCC resilience pathway. The training includes support material such as workbook and videos.

SUSTRANS VOLUNTEERING

Sustrans Scotland's I Bike Team delivers outdoor education in Aberdeen City and Shire schools, with the aim of promoting healthy travel choices. We run sessions such as Bikeability (learn to ride), playground scooter skills, led walks and rides, silent disco walks, Dr Bike etc. There is also an I Bike Communities programme, working with parents, teachers, carers, and other adults in Aberdeen City.

We're looking for volunteers to help run the sessions, see the links below for more information.

We cover the cost of travel expenses and any required training, for example; Cycle Ride Leader, Bikeability Scotland Instructor, basic bike maintenance, Velotech (bicycle mechanic qualification), First Aid, etc. Volunteering is flexible, but with schools volunteering please bear in mind that we don't deliver sessions outwith school hours, or during the school holidays. BUILDING A COMMUNITY ARTS HUB IN BANFF: THE FORGE

The Forge – Banff, a Community Interest Company founded in December last year, aims to become a thriving Community Arts Hub with a mission to offer wide range of activities, classes, and events that cater to the entire community. The vision is to infuse the town with a lively spirit and provide a welcoming space where everyone can come together to enjoy and learn.

The Forge joined NESCAN a few weeks ago. The Forge has also been fortunate to receive funding from the Aberdeenshire Two Towns Grant. The £5,000 grant has been instrumental in several key developments:

- Site Security: The grant allowed us to purchase a gate, securing the site for the first time since ownership.
- Community Garden: We've built planters that are being transformed into a community garden.
- Activity Shelter: We've constructed a shelter that enables us to host outdoor activities.

These developments have already had a positive impact, allowing us to run several outdoor-based activities over the summer, free of charge. This initial burst of activity is not just a service but also a promotional tool to raise awareness and get the community engaged with The Forge.
