### I HIS MONTH'S FEATURE

#### TORRY'S SECOND PEOPLE'S ASSEMBLY

Torry's second peoples' assembly was held on the 27th and 28th of May in the beautiful greenspace, a part of St Fittick's Park. Attended by around 150 people over the weekend, we discussed the challenges Torry has faced and started thinking through some of the ways that local people can claim the power to make change in their community and beyond.

The assembly's main focus was on St Fittick's park, because we had just received the long awaited pronouncement from the Scottish Government which upheld Aberdeen City Council's proposed rezoning of the park as an 'opportunity zone', opening the door for a new industrial development to be sited where there is now wetland, park space and trees. Emotions run high around this issue and, although we planned for a broader focus, this was clearly the one that assembly members wanted to work on. We discussed questions like: 'What problems does Torry face?' and 'Why do they happen?' We also considered: 'How shall we move towards making Torry happy and healthy?' From this process came a <u>Declaration</u>, which highlights many of the deliberations, discussions and comments people made in the process of the two days, and outlines the actions people committed to taking as a result.



We hope to continue the work begun through the assembly by fundraising for a resource worker who can support the community to respond to unwelcome developments, and build local capacity, for example through exploring the possibility of a Community-led retrofit project, and supporting a follow-up assembly.



Scot Gov are inviting members of the public to attend a workshop at Banchory Town Hall on Wednesday 28th June from 12:30–3.30 pm to feed into upcoming climate change plans, particularly relating to transport, buildings, agriculture, land use and adaptation to climate impacts.

Please note that registering only indicates an expression of interest, and the person registering will be contacted at least a week in advance to confirm their space and be provided with more information, support and resources. This is done to avoid the workshop being over-subscribed and to ensure that a balanced mix of voices is being heard. There will be further opportunities to engage on the policies being developed.

The event is open to anyone with ties to the local community in Banchory. This includes local residents, community group members, local business owners, volunteers, council members or others who want to share their views on the challenges and opportunities for a just transition to net zero in Banchory.



#### A very special performance of Pibroch at the Barn



We invite you to share a very special performance of Pibroch at the Barn on the 35th anniversary of the Piper Alpha disaster where 167 workers died in the North Sea. Widely regarded as the world's worst offshore oil disaster, those who were lost will never be forgotten.

**Keep Scotland Beautiful** will be running a series of online Zoom **climate change webinars** to support organisations and their audiences to engage meaningfully in this consultation process. #### Community Learning Exchange (SCCAN)

The community learning exchange makes £750 available to community groups for the purpose of visiting and being mentored by another group or organisation (eg. ebikes projects, community gardens, community trusts, etc...). £300 fee to the host organisation and £450 to cover travel, accommodation and subsistence. This is available to any member of SCCAN or to a non member of SCCAN visiting a SCCAN member. Multiple learning exchanges can be made. Very simple A4 application online form –

#### What is it?

The Community Climate Adaptation Routemap is an accessible guide for local communities to take practical actions to adapt to the impacts of climate change to help build more thriving communities. It provides resources for practical, easily digestible actions which communities can use to build resilience and adapt while also addressing social issues.

#### Why is it useful for me (a nescan member)?

The Routemap features over 50 hyperlinks which signpost members to dozens of resources by top climate science specialists, organisations and experts from across Scotland and beyond. It also addresses the fundamental root causes of climate change (colonialism and development) in a way that sets the stage for meaningful, justiceoriented action in the future.

#### What should I do with it?

You could read it through first and follow the links. Then gather your local contacts together with the route map open in front of you. Follow the steps in the map so an idea or a vision for your community can be developed into a workable, effective project that will make a genuine difference to people and the environment in your community. Make sure to bookmark it as it will be useful time and time again!
