On Friday 8th November, the public vote for the JTPB Fund opens, giving residents of Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire, and Moray the chance to directly influence which local projects receive funding.

This vote is a key part of the democratic process of the Fund, which allows people the opportunity to actively participate in shaping spending priorities in their communities by showing their support for initiatives that address local needs and priorities while also working towards Scotland's just transition to Net Zero.

This participatory budgeting approach, recognised by PB Scotland with the Green PB Seal, ensures that every funded project contributes meaningfully to the region's environmental goals.

Voting is **open to all ages**, and the online form will be accessible from 12 noon on 8th November at www.jtpbfund.scot, with the public vote closing at midday on 25th November.

### We're pleased to announce new developments for Climate Week North East (CWNE) in 2025

In response to community feedback, the recent success of Envirolution Aberdeen, a desire to align with Scottish Climate week plus activities taking place across other regional hubs, and a growing need for environmental action, we're making two key changes to enhance your experience and amplify the impact of CWNE25:

CWNE25 is on the move from its usual dates in March to \*\*September\*\* and will now run for two full weeks.

September is a busy time for everyone, but the decision to shift to early autumn was prompted not only due to community feedback but to align with other complementary environmental events across Scotland. Our fingers are crossed for favourable weather conditions, allowing for an even richer outdoor (and indoor) experience for participants and volunteers alike. 

### **FUNDING**

### The SEED Fund is still OPEN



NESCAN Hub has a small pot of funding for community climate action and biodiversity projects within Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire. The Seed Fund is designed for small community projects. Therefore we can only fund organisations with an income of less than £50,000 per annum.

Grants are allocated to eligible projects on a first come first served basis while funds remain. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, grants are a maximum of £500 per organisation to enable us to fund as many organisations and projects as possible.

### **FUNDING**

#### THE SUEZ COMMUNITY FUND - SCOTLAND

Scotland has approximately £200,000 available per year funded by donations from SUEZ Recycling and Recovery UK through the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund. There are 3 funding rounds each year. The second closing date is 20 November 2024 and decisions would be made by early February 2025. The clsoing date for the last round is 26 February 2025, and decision by mid-May.

## Just Transition Commission Scotland and Climate Change Committee UK Visit to Aberdeen

On October 3rd, we were honoured to have the Just Transition Commission Scotland and Climate Change Committee UK, joined by our partners from the Just Transition Communities Project (JTPC) for a day of impactful discussions, sharing both achievements and challenges in advancing a just and inclusive climate transition. The morning opened with presentations from the Commission, project leads and community members, each sharing unique insights. The milestones achieved by our communities through the project were emphasised. community voices added urgency to the discussions. As one resident expressed, "I hear people talking about climate change is all about carbon, carbon. What is carbon to me? We want to talk about our direct reality: we don't have a voice, we are not represented, we are not understood. We want our kids to have access to healthy food. I am a single mother; I want to use a bus that is not so expensive every day when I go and pick up my children from school." Such testimonials highlighted that a "Just Transition" isn't only about carbon reduction—it's about addressing inequalities and securing a future where social and climate justice are integrated into daily life.

The World Café session allowed participants to discuss topics that included young people, community participation in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire and Moray, Social Justice & Climate Justice, Partnership & Collaboration, where attendees moved around tables every 15 minutes to spark fresh ideas and questions. This interactive format reinforced the importance of open dialogue, feedback, and collective insight.

We welcomed the community in the evening for an open session discussions around eight key themes—Nature, Community Engagement, Communication, Bottom-Up Democracy, Energy, Land Use, New Economy and Employment, and Transport. Attendees shared their thoughts, recommendations, and visions for the future, affirming the importance of community voices in creating an inclusive transition. We thank our partners, participants, and community members for their vital contributions and look forward to advancing a just transition that truly reflects the values and aspirations of our communities.

#### **CLIMATE ACTION SUMMIT 2024**



Alison Stuart, the CEO of NESCAN Hub, participated as a panelist at the recent Climate Action Summit, alongside Clare Wharmby, Programme Director of the Scottish Climate Intelligence Service (SCIS), and Philip Raines, Deputy Director for Domestic Climate Change in Holyrood, on October 3rd, 2024. The summit gathered leaders and stakeholders from Scotland's various to discuss ambitious sectors decarbonisation initiatives and strategies for tackling climate change. Alison provided valuable insights on the progress achieved so far and the ongoing efforts required to facilitate Scotland's transition to net zero.
