The Barn is between Crathes Castle and Deeside town of Banchory. off the A93 and 30 minutes from Aberdeen.

By Bus: Take 201 or 202 buses from Aberdeen towards Braemar. Alight at the stop near TESCO Banchory and is approx. 10 min walk from the bus stop.

By Train: You can get trains to Aberdeen Railway Station for a bus connection. For latest train schedules, visit the **ScotRail website**.

By Car: Carpooling is a great way to reduce your carbon footprint. Get together with friends, or you could take a look at <u>Liftshare</u> — simply enter your postcode to find or offer a ride. If you're driving, see routes <u>here</u> from various parts of Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire.




Farewell and Best Wishes to Our Team Members

NESCAN's Art by Ade Adesina given to Aberdeen Art Gallery

On Thursday, 6th November 2024, Adam Price, Vice Chair of NESCAN Hub Board, handed over "Equilibrium" by Ade Adesina to Shona Elliot and Morna Annandale of Aberdeen Art Gallery at the Aberdeen Treasure Hub. The piece was commissioned from the Aberdeen-based artist by NESCAN



for its display and report at COP26 on Glasgow in 2021 using a grant from Greenpeace. The plan was always to get this picture about climate change and Aberdeen displayed in the city. It is hoped that the work will join Ade's other work "Wide Awake" that is on the first floor of the Art Gallery. Another of Ade's works is on display to the public right now in Edinburgh, a print entitle "Twenty Sixteen" in the City Art Centre. His "Day Watchers" is currently in storage in the National Museum of Modern Art (Modern Two).
