Health of the Sublime, in partnership with The Barn, invite participants to help make a multimedia handcrafted mindmap, based on the places we most intensely experience wellbeing and the sublime in the natural world.

Please bring a nature-based object from a place where you have experienced heightened wellbeing in nature (e.g. a shell, pebble, branch etc...) to be incorporated into a large flexible map, which will be joined with others to make a giant quilt of wellbeing. We will incorporate text, poems, textile skills (including embroidery) and other objects, and will engage in a discussion of the meaning of these, their connection to wellbeing, and how making and being in nature affect our outlook. Participants from the previous September session are very welcome and encouraged to return and continue the journey with us.

Leading the sessions is socially engaged interdisciplinary artist, Carrie Fertig, who works in performance, video, sound, installation, spoken word, and virtual reality. Fertig is also a maker in flameworked glass, used for its sonic properties including music and its ability to hold ideas. The foundation of her practice is engagement with collaborators or participants, and much of it is interactive to address emotional, spiritual, and physical states and thresholds. 

Artist Carrie Fertig, partnered with Mearns and Coastal Healthy Living Network, are excited to announce the third block of creative tuition of Health of the Sublime. This creative arts project for folk 50+, funded by Creative Scotland, focuses on our experience of wellbeing in nature through the lens of climate.

Video classes start Thursday 27th February-3rd April, 2025. Classes meet for two hours, once a week for six weeks. Video class meets outdoors, in and around Kincardineshire, Thursdays 10am-12 noon in a different location every week, usually followed by a cuppa and cake. Classes will change the way you see, hear, and experience nature. Video class includes audio and we will learn techniques improving both sound and vision as we add a big dose of wellbeing to our lives in a small supportive group. Led by project lead artist Carrie Fertig.

No experience needed. The course costs £10 total for six sessions inclusive. All proceeds support Mearns and Coastal Healthy Living Network. You can start after week one.
