One weekend in Cromar: A story on building connections by Gillian Needham

On Monday and Tuesday we work on our CromarFood Project Pop Up Shops in Tarland and Logie Coldstone. This food waste project seeks food surplus from wherever we can in the area. We generally get our food basics from the CFINE/Fareshare Aboyne Depot. We promote our Pop Ups through Marr Food Projects (WhatsApp Group hosted by Marr Area Partnership) and by advertising in our local Facebook community pages. We also use the local schools' Parents Association social media (thanks Catherine).

On Friday we organised a pick up from the Aboyne Coop - we generally freeze and store what they give as surplus.

Saturday are busy days, last month it was the Tarland Curling Club's Tractor Run and the Cromar Horticultural & Industrial Society's Annual Show. Tarland donated the butteries, butter and jam. Much home baking emerged too. Banchory Number One donated their surplus fruit and veg - which in this occasion included chard and pak choi galore. All remains were donated to the Pop Ups that attended the event.



These connections are not random, they are the result of embedding our Tarland Climate Crisis Group/Tarland Development Group CromarFood Project at the heart of all we do in our community.

Share, save, educate, reduce food waste, feed communities with as much locally sourced food as possible.

Marr Area Partnership host The CAFE project: Creative access to great local food for everyone, a project supporting communities to get affordable local food through networks, and get the joy back into eating.

NESCAN Hub Just Transition Fund (JT)

In July 2022, NESCAN Hub and partners submitted an expression of interest for the Scotland Just Transition Fund (JTF) to pilot a program of community-level climatefocused democratic participation as part of our planned climate change assemblies. This pilot will build on the experience of previous projects, incorporate emerging good practice from across the world which can be adapted to reach different communities and which, in subsequent years, can be implemented across the North-East, Scotland and globally.

Our Funding and Development Officer also supported several expressions of interest for the JFT from our members, including Deeside Climate Action Network, Inverurie Community Energy Society and Zero Carbon Daviot.

Participatory Budgeting (PB)

In May 2022, the Scottish Government announced a ten year £500 million Just Transition (JT) Capital Fund to support Scotland's North East economy in its just transition to net zero. For its first year in 2022/23, £20 million is made available and of that, £1 million will be subject to participatory budgeting (PB) which empowers communities to have a direct say on how money will be spent on just transition projects. The £1 million capital fund will be shared equally between Moray, Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire. The fund will be managed by the three TSIs (Third Sector Initiatives); ACVO (Aberdeen City Voluntary Organisation), AVA (Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action) and TSiMoray supported by NESCAN Hub and Money for Moray Group.

In July, NESCAN Hub and representatives from the three TSIs, Scottish Government, Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire Council and north east communities attended a

workshop in Aberdeen to hear presentations from each group and discuss each organisation's role in the PB process, the funding criteria and how to ensure the process is democratic, sustainable and transparent.

One of the findings of this workshop was that NESCAN Hub's role in the PB process will be to support the development of local criteria, support community groups to present their climate projects and signpost support to other networks. One of our biggest responsibilities will be to ensure that the participatory democracy principle of PB is met in that a diverse range of local people from local communities are involved and engaged in this process. This will be achieved through NESCAN Hub's planned Climate Change Assemblies.

Community Climate Change Assemblies

The NESCAN Hub Team will host several climate changes assemblies across the north east of Scotland beginning in Aberdeen City in November 2022. Each assembly workshop will be attended by a diverse range of community members along with experts on a range of sustainability, climate change and biodiversity themes. Community members will have the opportunity:

- To ask questions of the experts and NESCAN Hub team.
- Work together to produce a plan for locally led action.
- Learn how to lead practical projects to benefit their communities.
- Find out about funding options for their project.
- Present ideas to local and national government.
- Have their voice heard.

NESCAN Hub plans to run the climate change assemblies with different partner organisations using different models which have similar aims and objectives, but which differ in delivery. These assemblies will also allow us to pilot participatory deliberative processes as part of the Just Transition's Participatory Budgeting initiative and help build capacity in the north east of Scotland in the long term.

Although projects must meet our criteria below, once approved funding is allocated on a first come first served basis. To avoid disappointment & to fund as many Climate Action projects as we can, we encourage joint applications from groups, organisations or individuals with the same aims or outcomes & working on similar projects or within the same communities. SUEZ Communities Trust

The SUEZ Communities Trust administers part of the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund and can award smaller project grants of up to £20k or primary fund grants of up to £50k. This fund cannot pay staffing or operational running costs, but can award funding for the purchase of materials, equipment, and the appointment of contractors to undertake improvement work. The fund requires that the applying organisation either owns the site, or holds a lease with at least five years remaining. For legal/technical reasons, the fund requires an up-front contribution of 11.5% to be paid before any grant funds can be released. This contribution has to be secured from sources other than Landfill Communities Funding. Aberdeen City Council have indicated that they have match funding for local projects

EBike Grants

Transport Scotland has committed a further £900,000 of funding to assist local authorities, public sector agencies, further and higher education institutions, active travel hubs and community groups to adopt ebikes as a sustainable alternative to car journeys. The fund can be used to cover the cost of ebikes, etrikes, ecargo bikes, cargo bikes and trailers, tandems, adapted cycles, trikes and associated equipment. eBike Grant Fund available in Scotland - Energy Saving Trust

Learning from Scotland's Climate Assembly

Research findings on the Climate Assembly process, outcomes and impact and their implication for deliberative democracy in Scotland.

The Scottish Government funded a citizens' assembly on climate change, from Oct 2020 to March 2021. Over 100 people - broadly representative of the Scottish population - deliberated on the question "How should Scotland change to tackle the climate emergency in an effective and fair way?". See the extensive presentations they heard here. The assembly reported to Parliament in June 2021, and the Government published their response in Dec 2021. Book here.
