In this issue, we are recapping all you need to know about the NESCAN Hub and Climate Action in your area.

This month, NESCAN HUB is happy to announce that the Green Participatory Budgeting Fund from the Just Transition Fund is now open for applications. We welcome applications from third-sector organisations in Aberdeen City & Aberdeenshire for up to £50,000 capital funding for the purchase of tangible assets that support our transition to net zero.

We also invite you to learn about our upcoming NESCAN HUB events: Community Climate Change Assemblies and CWNE23. As usual, we have pulled together a series of events you don't want to miss.



Just Transition Participatory Budgeting Fund

As part of the drive to ensure that there is a just transition to net zero, the Scottish Government earlier this year announced a £500 million over 10 years Just Transition Fund covering Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire, and Moray. £20 million is being given out to capital products in this region this year. £1 million of which is going straight to communities through a capital participatory budgeting fund, which ACVO, AVA, TSI Moray, NESCAN Hub, and Money 4 Moray are running.

This green participatory budgeting fund means that communities will have the opportunity to put forward carbon-reducing local projects and everyone in the North East gets to vote for the green community projects that they want to see financed.

It is a fantastic opportunity for communities to come together and think up some great projects that can help tackle climate change and enhance the community, and get those funded. Participatory Budgeting is not new to this region but this is the first time this level of money has been put into a region-wide fund for green participatory budgeting. With £333,333 being allocated in each local authority area, it will be exciting to see what communities decide the money will be spent on.



The Just Transition Participatory Budgeting Fund is a capital fund: it helps buy tangible things like tools, bikes, equipment, trees, and plants, really any item that could be used in a community project to reduce carbon emissions and increase sustainability. The fund is open to community groups, charities, and other non-profit organisations, with an upper funding limit of £50,000 per application. The Fund opens on Friday 30th September, with a range of information and drop-in events being organised to help communities develop their bids for the Fund. NESCAN HUB Community Assembly 2023

The NESCAN Hub Team will host a community assembly for Tillydrone, Seaton, Linksfield and Woodside in Aberdeen City in January 2023.

Each assembly workshop will be attended by a diverse range of community members along with experts on a range of sustainability, climate change, and biodiversity themes. Throughout the sessions, participants will co-create:

- Actions/projects that communities can take forward themselves without any help at all.
- Actions/ projects that the community can do with help from elsewhere such as, funding and advice from NESCAN Hub, the local authorities, and other partners.
- Actions/ projects that the community can do in partnership with the local authority, school, business, or other statutory bodies

The Assembly participants will also have the opportunity to identify actions that require systemic change at a regional or national level, and to explore ways of raising these with people in power such as through a formal document, letters to MPs, meeting with MSPs or councillors etc.



Participants will receive ongoing support after the event from NESCAN Hub to take

these actions and projects forward, including the wider community and relevant partners in the discussions and deliberations, to gain widespread community feedback and final approval.

There will be a celebration event, as part of <u>Climate Week North East</u>., attended by key council officials and councillors, among others, where you will present your community's action plan.

Aberdeen City Council's Community Festive Fund

is NOW OPEN for applications.

The Community Festive Fund was established to encourage organisations and groups to come together within their own communities during the Christmas and Hogmanay periods to celebrate community wellbeing and togetherness. The fund can provide a small financial grant to individual community groups and organisations who are arranging a celebration for their local community or continuing to grow and develop an existing event that may already be held within Aberdeen City. The funding available for any group or organisation is up to a maximum of £350 for Festive events and £500 for Hogmanay events. Groups should be aware that the demand for funding is likely to be greater than the allocation provided by Aberdeen City Council. In such circumstances, funding will be split on a proportionate basis with groups receiving less than originally applied for.

The Social Enterprise Just Transition Fund (SEJTF) is aligned to the Scottish Government's Just Transition Fund, a commitment that will support projects in Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire, and Moray.

The Fund aims to finance organisations, businesses, communities and individuals to transition to net zero, creating jobs in low carbon industries and contributing to the region's future prosperity. SEJTF will be a blended product with an equal 50 / 50 loan-grant split.

Rural and Island Communities Ideas into Action Fund-2022 Funding

On the 8th of September the Scottish Government (Rural Economy & Communities) announced a \pounds 3m funding pot for rural & island community-led local development. The Rural and Island Communities Ideas into Action Fund is a \pounds 3 million investment from the Scottish Government to encourage and enable community groups to design and deliver solutions to local challenges in rural communities across Scotland. Two strands of funding are available grants of up to \pounds 5,000 available for grassroots community groups, and up to \pounds 100,000 for incorporated community groups based in rural places in Scotland.

<u>Inspiring Scotland</u> is managing this funding, which is focused on enabling communities to design and deliver local solutions to their local challenges. Projects should respond to aspects of rural poverty, net zero & climate action, or covid-19 recovery – so lot of potential for themes of climate justice.

Projects funded will contribute positively to local people and local priorities. Projects must be led by their community and completed by March 2023.

EBike Grants

Transport Scotland has committed a further £900,000 of funding to assist local authorities, public sector agencies, further and higher education institutions, active travel hubs and community groups to adopt ebikes as a sustainable alternative to car journeys. The fund can be used to cover the cost of ebikes, etrikes, ecargo bikes, cargo bikes and trailers, tandems, adapted cycles, trikes and associated equipment. <u>eBike Grant Fund available in Scotland - Energy Saving Trust</u>

As part of the Scottish Government's consultation process to develop a new Agriculture Bill, eight regional events will be held in locations across Scotland.

These will be general sessions looking at the proposals of the Agriculture Bill. There will also be four online virtual events focusing on specific themes included in the bill. Further information on these can be found here:

Join members of Applied Arts Scotland and the Barn team for an online panel discussion exploring decarbonizing applied arts as part of the exhibition [MATTER] Earth, Materials + Making exhibition currently on show at the Barn.

Over the past two years as part of Applied Arts Scotland's Closing the Loop Group makers have developed exploratory works from a diverse range of environmentally aware approaches that re-use waste, value biodiversity, local materials, and production systems.



The discussion will consider questions of decarbonization in Applied Arts and craft practices more broadly; drawing inspiration from these makers and the new circumstances of practice brought about by working with and thinking about environmentally considered crafts. This will include reflections from the makers on how this has played out in their practice through material choices and production systems, ideas of slow craft, thoughtful connections to place, and social inclusion.





The Big Picture in Scotland

In some parts of Scotland, whole landscapes are already being transformed. Young forests are on the march, river systems are being restored and by giving nature more space, wetlands, and peatlands are regenerating. Wild animals, such as beavers, red squirrels, and golden eagles are being reintroduced to roam unimpeded across a landscape shaped and governed by natural processes.

Elsewhere in towns and cities, passionate communities are working together to create more space for bats, bees, and butterflies, in parks, gardens, and public spaces.

The vision that unites rewilding at these different scales, is one of restoration and recovery – a commitment to transform our degraded ecosystems so that they work in all their colourful complexity.

<u>The Scottish Rewilding Alliance</u> is calling on the Scottish Government to declare Scotland the world's first Rewilding Nation.

Rewilding is a simple idea: let's work with nature instead of against it. Rewilding helps to restore biodiversity, mitigates climate change, supports rural communities,
