The Barn and Health of the Sublime invite participants to help make a multimedia handcrafted 'mindmap', based on the places we most intensely experience 'wellbeing' and 'the sublime' in the natural world.

Please bring a nature-based object which resonates with you creatively (e.g. a shell, pebble, branch etc...) to be incorporated into the large flexible map, which will be joined with others to make a giant quilt of wellbeing. LEAF - LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION FUND

Thank you everyone for your interest to the Local Environmental Action Fund (LEAF). We received an overwhelming number of applications for excellent projects and are currently reviewing them. Unfortunately, we will not be able to fund them all this round, but hope to have more available opportunities later in the year. Successful applicants will be notified in the upcoming weeks.

The SEED Fund is still OPEN



NESCAN Hub has a small pot of funding for community climate action and biodiversity projects within Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire. The Seed Fund is designed for small community projects. Therefore we can only fund organisations with an income of less than £50,000 per annum.

Grants are allocated to eligible projects on a first come first served basis while funds remain. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, grants are a maximum of £500 per organisation to enable us to fund as many organisations and projects as possible.
